Mount Macedon Hotel on Sunday 26 November 2023

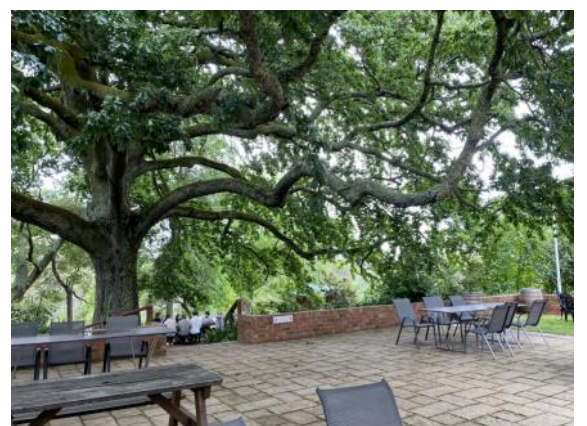
Sadly, the function room booked by Jon several months earlier was not available due to renovations. Happily, a fairy-light festooned marquee in the garden was all ours, complete with bar.
