SECRETARY'S NOTES:-

Dick Langworth has sent me his latest book titled "Tiger Alpine Rapier" and as promised, a very large chapter on Humbers and includes many photos of MKII and IIIs going sideways up the mountains in the '50s Monte Carlo Rallys of which a Humber Super Snipe made 2nd overall in 1950. Other photos include factory scenes of Super Snipes (60's) being assembled. There are also production figures for all post war Humbers and oddly enough there are MKV Super Snipes listed (55-56) which had auto transmission as an option and they made 1268 of them!

Mainly, the books purpose was to give a history of all Rootes products in sport, and Dick's original title of "Sporting Rootes" would not need explanation of why so much Humber information is included, but, as it was Sunbeam which represented Rootes in 80% of all sporting activities, the publishers saw fit to change the title to "Tiger Alpine Rapier".

Dick has owned a Sunbeam Tiger and now currently owns a Harrington Le Mans (fastback Sunbeam Alpine), and of course, a Humber Imperial, so he was able to write this book from 1st hand knowledge and his lavish praises of Humbers are very well received from this particular Humber owner, and I expect any other Humber owners who may be a little starved of reading matter on their favourite car.

The book gives a great insight into the managerial side of the Rootes Hierarchy and why's and where-fores of decisions which gave and then took away from us some of the world's best cars. It's a book I think should be on every Humber Owner's library shelf, but especially anyone interested in history of motor sport. I'm sure anyone with a Sunbeam will most certainly snap it up.

WATER IN CRANKCASE

Serious lubrication troubles may result in cold weather by an accumulation of water in the oil reservoir. This condition is as a rule little understood by the car owner. To demonstrate the chief cause of water in the oil reservoir, hold a piece of cold metal near the end of the exhaust pipe of the engine and note the rapid condensation and collection of drops of water on it. The exhaust gases are charged with water vapour and the moment these gases strike a cold surface, will condense, forming drops of water.

On account of a certain amount of these gases passing the pistons and rings, even under the most favourable conditions, we will have the formation of water in the oil reservoir, in a greater or less degree, until the engine becomes warm. When the engine becomes thoroughly warm, the crankcase will no longer act as a condenser and all of these gases will pass out through the crankcase ventilator system.

Short runs in cold weather, such as city driving, will aggravate this condition.




