HANDY HUMBER HINTS.

On the series model cars the mounting bolts that hold the front wishbones to front crossmember have a tendancy to come loose, and subsequently they could possibly come out with disastrous results! As a precaution every so often (every service?) just check to make sure that they are still tight.

Radiator hose leaking? As a tempory measure to keep yourself mobile remove the radiator cap which in turn will reduce the "water pressure" and slow down the leakage rate.

Faulty Series 111 & 1V differentials can be replaced by a MK 111 Zephyr diff. which is reputed to be stronger and to have .025" lepth of hard face on the teeth. The Zephyr diff. does require slight modification to fit but differential specialists have all the details on this.

(An alternate solution to the above is try our Spare Parts Officer).
