EDITORIAL

GILLTRAPS MUSEUM FEATURES WORKING EXHIBITIONS OF VETERAN CARSAND THESE EXHIBITIONS ARE QUITE HUMOROUS AS SOME OF THE ECCENTRICITIES OF THE CARS ARE SHOWN IN ACTUAL RECENTARY PRACTICE.

ONE SUCH CAR WAS A 1914 TWOMBLEY WHICH HAD INFINITELY VARIABLE TRANSMISSION IN BOTH REVERSE AND FORWARD GEARS. THIS WAS ACHIEVED BY A FRICTION DISC (FLYWHEEL) AND THE TRANSMISSION DRIVE WAS A DISC AT RIGHT ANGLES TO THE FLYWHEEL. AS THE TRANSMISSION DISK WAS MOVED TO THE OUTER PERIMETER OF THE FLYWHEEL ITS SPEED WAS INCREASED. THIS TRANSMISSION WAS TERRIFIC UNTIL A SPOT OF ENGINE OIL FOUND ITS WAY ONTO THE FLYWHEEL AND BEING FRICTION DRIVE BETWEEN THEM THE VEHICLE REMAINED MOTIONLESS.

ANOTHER INTERESTING CAR WAS A 1914 DETROIT ELECTRIC CAR WHICH WAS POWERED BY BATTERIES. THE CAR LOOKED LIKE A STAGE COACH WITH HEADLAMPS. THE STEERING WAS BY TILLER AND BEING ELECTRIC THE CAR WAS "DEAD" QUIET (ESPECIALLY COMPARED WITH THE OTHER VETERANS). THIS DETROIT ELECTRIC WAS STILL IN EXCELLENT ORIGINAL ORDER.

A LARGE PROPORTION OF THE CARS IN THE MUSEUM WERE IN ORIGINAL ORDER AND OBVIOUSLY SOME OF THEM NEEDED MINOR RESTORATION.

IN LAST MONTHS NEWSLETTER IT WAS MENTIONED THAT THE INDICATOR ASSY/HEADLIGHT XX FLASHER THAT IS FITTED TO SER IV CARS ON, CAN BE REPAIRED WITH A SPRING KIT.

THIS IS QUITE CORRECT AND IF YOU FIND ANY OTHER PART OF THE ASSEMBLY IS FAULTY (IE BROKEN STEM ETC) THE WHOLE UNIT WILL HAVE TO BE REPLACED.

AFTER A PERIOD OF USE THE CASTING BODY OF THE ASSY BECOMES WORN ON THE AREAS THAT COME INTO CONTACT WITH THE NYLON SPRING. THE UNIT COMPLETE COSTS \$26 EACH TRADE. (LUCAS SALES & SERVICE).

THE SER VA (I THINK SER V ALSO) HAVE A DIFFERENT INDICATOR UNIT TO THE SER IV AND EXAMEN CANNOT BE INTER-CHANGED AS THE HORN RING CONTACT POST IS A DIFFERENT HEIGHT. THE POST CANNOT BE REMOVED FROM ONE INDICATOR ASSY TO ANOTHER AS IT IS CLAMPED ONTO THE BODY CASTING (GOOD OLD LUCAS LOGIC!!!)
