DIESEL CAR ENGINES

For those people thinking diesel engines it is interesting to note that Mercedes have produced in excess of two million diesel powered cars. You might be surprised at the amount and who is building and testing diesel motors for fitting into cars:— Volkswagon as you all know have 4 cylinder cars, but did you know they also have 5 and 6 cylinder motors plus a V8 on paper at this time for research purposes. Peugeot — Citroen have 4 cylinder powered cars with and without turbochargers. The Japanese are well in the act with Toyota Crown powered with a 4 cylinder motor. Isuzu also have a 4 cylinder diesel car, the Florian. These two companies are just a couple going diesel.

In the other countries we have B.M.W. with turbocharged 4 cylinder diesels plus 6 cylinder motors. In the States all of the big names are running diesel powered cars, General Motors have fitted a V8 diesel into the Cadillac Seville (sorry about that) 25 MPG in the city, 36 MPG highway.

Above is only a few of the companies involved with diesel power. Well, have fun sorting it all out. Happy motoring.

1980 INTERNATIONAL MOTOR SHOW CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE

The organisers of this event had a creditable turnout despite the rain early in the day and it seemed to me that the MG Club was behind the V.A.C.C.

The organisation was well done and everything went off smoothly. I was disappointed to find that I was the sole representative of the Humber Club, particularly as my Snipe was arrayed alongside a magnificent 1955 black 300 Mercedes with driver in full chauffeur's livery! Judging was done by a number of examiners who were less thorough than we had at Como for our 1979 Concours. There were eight in the Luxury Class apart from the Snipe namely: Mercedes 300, Studebaker Hawk GT, Customline (single spinner), Ford Zephyr Zodiac, Chevrolet '59 with "porch lights" under the gull wings, Chevrolet 1960 (much less ostentatious), both beautifully re-ducoed and presented. A 1954 Austin 40 and an Austin Cambridge sedan. The first thing we had to do was drive on to a ramp and stop while an announcer gave the vital statistics of the vehicle and receive some "goodies" by Repco, then revert to our judging places.

In the Luxury Class the 300 Mercedes won while I received a commendation from the judge for an original car.

The class winners were - Mercedes 1955 300 Sedan, a lovely Riley drophead an Austin A40 with whitewall tyres, Mercedes 2 door sports (beautifully presented in red & white colours) and an MG Sedan with sliding roof was the most desirable car. Overall the red Mercedes won but it was not on display at the motor show because of its VALUE..

I attended the Motor Show and saw our Club banner standing out proudly & also John Browne's Mk III. Don't know how they lifted that 2 tons of car up to the balcony. There was a good display of car clubs cars. The show was a disappointment to me except for the Rolls Silver Shadow there was nothing on which I would trade either of my cars. RALF CHALMERS
