For instance a head gasket \$80-, a second hand distributor \$81 accelerator pump (and there's two of them) \$32 each and that was just to get the engine running. The Benz did however have some good points such as braking and handling, but one of the worst faults is rust. Probably worse than an early Holden. A Humber is definitely a more practical car to own and maintain, so it's good-bye Benz.

We thought perhaps a Series V would be the best replacement for the M.B. and started looking around. We did however receive information of a Series Va which we looked at and are very interested in buying. It's a car I would very much like to see in the Club so if negotiations break down and anyone's interested in a va and would like more details, just give me a ring.




