

Secure screws

Here are a few ideas to help with the annoying problem of trying to locate a screw in an inaccessible hole.






2 Slip-in gasket

Replacing exhaust and inlet manifold gaskets can be a fiddly job particularly on the Mini, Austin 1100 and other transverse-engined cars where the manifold is between the engine and the bulkhead. The manifold is usually held on by studs and to remove it you must release the exhaust pipe from the lower end of the manifold before drawing it off the studs.

Providing you are careful, the idea illustrated above gives a repair which is both reliable and time-saving.

Remove the old gasket by unscrewing the stud nuts and pulling back the manifold as far as it will go, you will then have to cut the gasket away at the stud holes. Clean up the surfaces of the cylinder head and the manifold and then cut slots, as shown, in the new gasket. Drop this over the studs making sure that the gasket is in the correct position and not obscuring the port openings in any way. Now screw the nuts up tight starting at the centre and working outwards. When you next do a more serious job on the engine you can replace this with a complete gasket, to be on the safe side.




3 Swivel storage jars

Almost certainly some food or household product you use in the home will be bought in a screw-top glass jar—coffee for instance. Over a period of months you will probably accumulate a fair number of these when they will either be thrown away or maybe used for storage.

A neat way of providing extra storage space in the workshop without spending money and with the advantage of an instant visual check is shown in the illustration.

Construct a pair of wall brackets either from wood, as shown, or by modifying metal shelf brackets and then find a square section block of wood measuring in depth at least as much as the diameter of the jars. The length depends on the number of jars. Fix this block between the two brackets on swivels and then screw the jar tops on to the block as shown. The jars will now screw on and the block can be rotated until the required jar is found.

Another feature of the event is the display of exotic and rare vintage motor-cycles along with associated vehicles and other wintage paraphenalia.



The prices are:-


- 1. Entry to the Trade Night: \$2 per head, V.D.C. members and their immediate families are free.




