To give that "New Look" to faded and weatherbeaten rubber, black "nugget" is an inexpensive remedy. Application is the same as when you put it on your boots. Parts on cars where nugget can be used:Tyres, Windscreen Rubbers, Pedal Rubbers, Running Board Rubbers Radiator Hoses etc.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION: -

DIFFERENCES BETWEEN ENGINES IN SERIES 1, 11, 111, 1V CARS

CAPACITIES - SERIES 1 2691 CC - SERIES 11, 111, AND 1V 2951 CC

On Series 111 engines the following changes were made:-

- 1) Cylinder block atlered to give a different angle of inclination to the distributor.
- 2) Indium flashed copper lead bearings fitted to the front and two intermediate main bearings only, a white metal bearing is still used for the rear main bearings.
- 3) The oil pump drive gear on the camshaft altered to the rease the oil pump speed to give a greater output from the oil pump. The distributor drive gear has also been altered to accommodate the changed position of the distributor (Refer to point 1)

On Series 1V engines the following additional changes ware made:-

- 1) Closer fitting solid skirt pistons are used in place of the previous split skirt pistons.
- 2) Larger inlet valves
- 3) Dual valves springs fitted
- 4) Crankshaft pulley with additional "groove" to allow twin vee belt if air conditioner is to be fitted
- Different flywheel to take diaphragm type clutch.

I hope that the above information will clear up a few minds on engine changes, all changes were to improve an already great engine.
